THE SWINGING DOOR

- ♦ Print out the four pages: two pages of pictures, one page of green narration cards, and one page of orange narration cards. Laminate (optional) and cut up. (In cutting the picture cards, cut through the middle of each gray line. This should make all the borders uniform.)
- ♦ There is also a vocabulary matching exercise. This could be used before or after any of the three steps above, depending on your students' needs and abilities.

STEP ONE:


Randomly distribute the picture cards (the same number to each player, if possible). Do the same with the narration cards **without** numbers (the green cards). The players take turns reading one narration card per turn, and each player checks to see if they have the matching picture.


STEP TWO:

Collect the green cards and put them aside. You are done with them. Collect, shuffle, and redistribute the picture cards as before, this time along with the narration cards **with** numbers (the orange cards). The players again take turns reading, but this time in numerical sequence. (The picture cards are in the proper sequence before you cut them up.) The players again look for the matching pictures, this time putting them in narrative order.

STEP THREE:

Collect the orange cards and put them aside. You are done with them. Collect, shuffle, and redistribute the picture cards one more time. Have the players re-tell the story, using only the picture cards as cues. That is, whoever has the first picture card puts it on the table and gives their own narration. (This can, but does not need to, follow the wording on the narration cards they read in steps one and two.) The player with the second picture card goes next, and so on.
